8. What is your favorite type of tree?

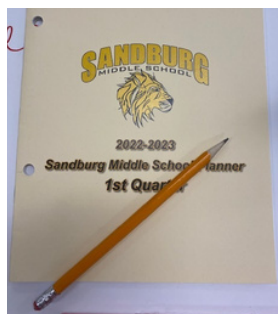
An Oak tree. It has wisdom, is hard and has a story to tell.

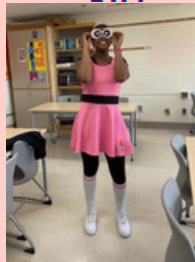
For those of you who get stressed out by the amount of assignments that are shoveled onto the pile each day, a planner can relieve some of that tension.
