Students engage in AP preparation in all core courses. SMS utilizes CollegeBoard's SpringBoard® English curriculum program with all students in grades 6-8. Students are prepared for high intellectual performance by starting the development of critical literacy skills as early as possible.

SMS students are placed on grade level teams which allow them to be a part of smaller learning communities. These smaller learning communities help students successfully transition from elementary to middle school.

SMS provides Advancement Via

Individual Determination (AVID) in both a school-wide model and as an elective course for qualifying students. AVID is a college readiness program that supports research-based methods for instruction for all students. The elective course is designed to help students in the academic middleespecially those who will be the first in their family to attend college—prepare for and succeed in college.
